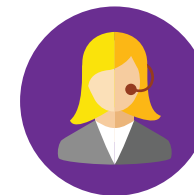

- lead to greater independence



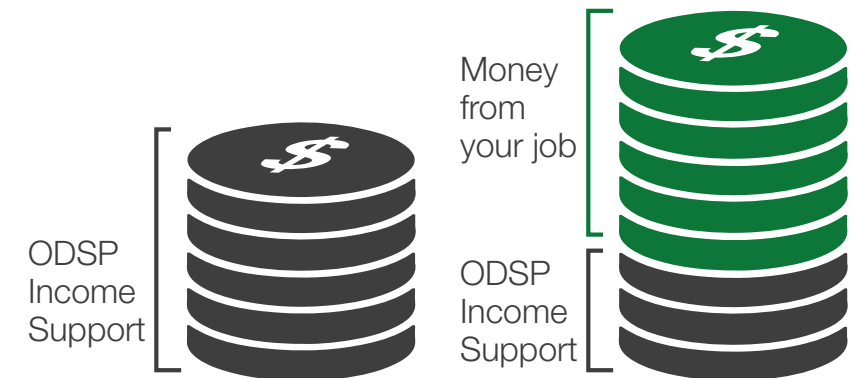
## + keep your benefits.
