Summary of Critical Points

This report provides a weekly summary regarding the impact and response to the COVID-19 Pandemic, and more frequently as required, and focuses on the following topics:

Overall Tends this week

The Government extended Ontario's state of emergency until September 22.

MCCSS have provided an updated document for reopening of congregate living settings that encompasses visitors, short stay absences, outings and essential overnight absences.

This document acknowledges the rights of people to enjoy participation in the life in the community, while mitigating risks of doing so. CLOC has updated the guidelines document, which went out on 3^{rd} of September, and reissued on the 8^{th} .

This document describes that Each group living location, or person, must have an individualized **Enhanced Precaution Plans for Location Visits, Short Stay Absences and Outings, and Essential Absences**, that assesses and considers the persons' support and safety needs and safety concerns. All visits must adhere to the Ministry of Community Children and Social Services (MCCSS) Visitor's Guidelines 2.0: Re-Opening of Congregate Living Settings, as well as health directives and CLOC's infection control procedures to ensure that people are safe, and ensure risks are mitigated, and reduce the threat of exposure to COVID-19.

COVID-19 Cases

Over the past the 2 weeks, there have been 4 with staff tested, all with negative results. (*To date 31 people served have been tested, with 5 positive and 26 negative results; and 45 staff have been tested with 4 positive and 41 negative results; 6 people tested in program locations, all with negative results)*

Communication

Weekly communication is continuing. One communique regarding one staff tested positive.

Impacts on Employees

The \$2.50 per hour will end September 5th. We are anticipating feedback after next pay period.

Impacts on People Supported

We continue to educate and develop safety plans around community participation and visits as things have opened up.

Day services remain closed. Developing plans regarding how day services will operate in the future.

Inventory of PPE is stable, with an adequate supply of materials on hand.

Human Resources Update

Employee work schedules have been extended to October 6.

Finance

We have submitted CRRF (COVID Residential Relief Fund) and final report for pandemic was submitted September 3rd.
